KEY STATISTICS



- · 236,000 new diagnoses
- 1 in 16 lifetime risk
- Every 2.2 minutes, someone is diagnosed

SURVIVAL & MORTALITY



- · 27% overall 5-year survival rate
- 64% survival when caught early
- 124,500 deaths expected in 2025



Only 22% are diagnosed at the earliest stage Low-dose CT screening can reduce mortality

SCREENING GUIDELINES

Who Should Be Screened:



- Ages 50-80
- 20+ pack-year smoking history
- Currently smoke or quit within 15 years

Check with your healthcare provider about an annual low-dose CT scan
